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WIDENING THE CIRCLE, 2025 HIGHLIGHTS IN CARE

Saint Francis Ministries has always been driven by a simple rhythm: recognizing needs, finding solutions, and taking action. Through education, advocacy, and action, we widen the circle of care, engaging community partners, donors, and legislators in our life-affirming work. By sharing the stories of everyday heroes, we highlight the sacred relationships between those who give and receive care, each with their own hopes, histories, and humanity.

The following illustrates how some of these relationships took root and were sustained in fiscal year 2025:

Texas Home Visiting

This year, Saint Francis Ministries expanded our presence in Central Texas, launching Foster Care and In-Home Prevention services from new offices at St. Alban's Episcopal Church in Waco. We celebrated this meaningful partnership with a grand opening event in July.

Among these new offerings is Texas Home Visiting (THV), a voluntary, no-cost program for families in McLennan and Bell Counties. Designed to offer hope and support before foster care or child protective services become necessary, THV provides in-home visits from early childhood and health professionals to families with children aged five and under. This evidence-based model promotes healthy child development, strengthens family stability, and helps build thriving communities.





Poverty Simulation

In May, Saint Francis Ministries partnered with local organizations in Lubbock to host a Poverty Simulation at St. Stephen's Episcopal Church. This hands-on, interactive experience gave participants a deeper understanding of the realities of poverty while providing valuable insight to community leaders and service providers about systemic barriers. The event demonstrated the power of education in driving social change.

SOUL Family Option

Each of our programs uses evidence-based strategies to support our vision of transforming lives and systems. One powerful example is the SOUL Family Permanency option. In partnership with the Annie E. Casey Foundation, Saint Francis Ministries championed legislation to create a fourth path to legal permanency for youth in foster care—Support, Opportunity, Unity, and Legal (SOUL) relationships.

Historically, reunification, guardianship, and adoption were the only legal options. SOUL changes that by legally connecting young people aged 16 and older with at least one committed, caring adult as they transition to adulthood.

This groundbreaking effort became law in Kansas on May 14, making the state the first to adopt the model. By September, Saint Francis celebrated the nation's first SOUL appointment, followed by a second for a teen boy placed with the Schmidtbergers, our Foster Family of the Year.

THE POWER OF PARTNERSHIPS AND STORY TO TRANSFORM LIVES

Supporters, partners, and friends gathered in April at the Buckner campus to celebrate Saint Francis Ministries' ongoing commitment to Lubbock and the Texas Panhandle. Saint Francis has long recognized that community partners are essential to our mission. Community support, advocacy, and collaboration make it possible to deliver the programs and services that help children and families heal and thrive.

More than 30 guests gathered in the newly refurbished community room to hear remarks from Board of Directors Chair Brock Slabach and CEO William Clark, along with Rachel Williams-Ehue, Vice President of Texas Permanency; Valerie Leon, Vice President of Foster Care Homes, Katherine May, Executive Director of In-Home Prevention Services in Texas, and Cristian Garcia, Chief Program Officer.

A surprise appearance by Christy Martinez-Garcia, District 1 City Councilwoman and Mayor Pro Tempore of the City of Lubbock, proved one of the high points of the evening. She shared a story about her grandparents' experience with kinship care and reflected on the importance of family, children, and community. Saint Francis was also honored by the presence of the Right Reverend J. Scott Mayer, Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Northwest Texas, who offered the benediction.





In May, more than 50 Kansas foster families joined Saint Francis
Ministries for "Safe at Home," an appreciation event during the Wichita
Wind Surge game against the Tulsa Drillers. As part of Foster Care Appreciation
Month, the evening honored the strength and resilience of foster families.

The event also included a community gathering at the Wichita Baseball Museum at Equity Bank Stadium, where representatives from 28 local organizations connected with SFM leadership and viewed newly released videos showcasing powerful stories of healing and hope. Attendees included elected officials, faith leaders, community partners, and other local leaders.

Among those present were State Senator Oletha Faust-Goudeau, minority member of the Joint Committee on Child Welfare System Oversight, and State Representative Cyndi Howerton, Chair of the Child Welfare Committee and Vice Chair of the Joint Committee.

Another highlight of the evening included CEO William Clark joining his 11-year-old grandson on the mound as Ben threw the game's ceremonial first pitch.

OUR PURPOSE

The story of Saint Francis Ministries begins with 12 adolescent boys 80 years ago, when the Reverend Robert Mize Jr. founded Saint Francis Boys' Home in rural Kansas. Today, our 1,250 employees serve more than 9,000 boys, girls, and families in six states – Arkansas, Kansas, Mississippi, Nebraska, Oklahoma, and Texas – with a full range of evidence-based programs and services. Every person we serve has dignity and worth. Each represents a story of healing and hope.

Recognizing and honoring the uniqueness of each family and individual, we don't follow a one-size-fits-all philosophy. Rather, we focus on providing the best possible care to children and families because we believe that strong families make children's lives better.

Our focus on care supports our vision of transforming lives and systems, and empowering families with the skills and tools they need to heal and regain their wholeness is the most effective way to achieve that vision. We don't just want to keep kids safe through foster care; we want to keep them from entering foster care in the first place. The healthiest families are those equipped with the coping strategies and communication skills they need to remain safely together. Saint Francis provides them those strategies and skills.

A MINISTRY OF SECOND CHANCES

Young people dealing with trauma and needing a safe place to land until they can return to their families or find a forever family through adoption; adults and youth struggling with addiction; families dealing with stressors like poverty and generational trauma; men hoping to be better husbands and fathers; adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities who want to work and live independently; and families hoping to heal and stay together – this is who we serve.

Every day, 1,250 Saint Francis employees work to help make life better for those in our care. Every day, social workers, therapists, case workers, and support staff dedicate themselves to changing the world one child, one youth, one family at a time. We are a ministry of second chances because redemption is in our DNA. We've seen second chances change lives in beautiful ways.





Keeping Families Together

Saint Francis' Intensive In-Home Services focus on keeping families together. We serve 52 Arkansas counties from our location in Little Rock, helping them develop the solutions and skills they need to reduce risks in everyday situations.

Integral to our Intensive In-Home Services is Family Centered Treatment® (FCT), an evidence-based model that focuses on working with the family to build a stable, healthy future. Families learn to build upon their existing strengths so they can better provide for the health and security of their children.

According to national data, 98 percent of all families that complete FCT had a positive placement at closure. But that's just a number. The testimony of families who have participated in the program proves the real power of Family Centered Treatment. The Andrews are one such family.

Pioneering in Permanency

Headquartered in Kansas since our founding in 1945, Saint Francis Ministries continues to have its largest presence in the Sunflower State. Today, our work encompasses foster care, adoption, family preservation, behavioral health, residential programs, human trafficking prevention, Family Centered Treatment®, Seeking Safety®, Fatherhood FIRE, and Independent Living for youth transitioning out of foster care.

Each of these programs is rooted in evidence-based strategies and supports our vision to transform both lives and systems. All are anchored in prevention and permanency—two essentials for creating lasting change. In child welfare, permanency means ensuring every child has a safe, stable, and nurturing family connection for life—through reunification with parents, adoption, or legal guardianship. Permanency offers the stability and sense of belonging children need for healthy development and a strong identity.

That same goal guides our Independent Living program, which equips young people with the skills they need for a successful adulthood. It also undergirds the SOUL Family Permanency option (see page 4), which helps youth leaving foster care form a permanent legal bond with a caring adult of their choice—strengthening identity, belonging, and connection.

Building Bridges, Changing Lives

Our Bridgeway residential program in Picayune provides supervised, shared, and supported living, supported employment, and job discovery services to adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD), so they can live and work as independently as possible. Adults ages 18 years and older with IDD are eligible for residency and services.

Our Day Services – Adult program in Picayune serves Pearl River and Hancock Counties by providing adults with IDD regularly scheduled individualized activities in a non-residential setting outside the home. All our Mississippi programs honor the dignity of those we serve by helping them live and work as independently as possible so they can chart the course of their own lives.

Planting Hope on the Plains

Hard work, sacrifice, and strong families are values shared by Saint Francis and our Nebraska foster parents. We like to use the term "everyday heroes" to describe our frontline staff, community partners, and especially, our foster families who provide care to children in Grand Island, North Platte, and Omaha.

Every day, foster parents work without fanfare to ensure the kids in their care are nurtured and protected until they can safely return to their families or find a permanent new home.

Big State, Big Results

Located in Lubbock, our Brentwood campus is home to multiple Panhandle programs and services, including foster care and adoption. Our Family Centered Treatment® programs in Lubbock and Amarillo serve children and families in both the home and the community. Saint Francis Ministries proudly serves 41 Panhandle counties as the Single Source Continuum Contractor (SSCC) provider.

Saint Francis has also partnered with Texas families in McLennan and Bell Counties to offer Texas Home Visiting (THV), a free, voluntary program through which early childhood and health professionals regularly visit the homes of families with at least one child aged five years or younger. From our office at St. Alban's Episcopal Church in Waco, Saint Francis provides THV, Foster Care, and In-Home Prevention services to children and families in Central Texas.

By meeting families where they need us most, Saint Francis Ministries changes lives every day.

Seeing Need, Identifying Solutions

Whenever Saint Francis Ministries expands our reach or develops new programs, we move to meet a real need and serve the underserved. From the beginning, we have responded with compassion to those who need help most..

Our top priority is the safety of children, followed closely by the strengthening and healing of families—because kids thrive in healthy, stable homes. From the moment a child enters our care, we work toward a safe, permanent living situation that preserves family connections whenever possible.

However, preventing children from entering state custody at all is the best possible outcome. That's why prevention is at the heart of our mission. Our programs honor the dignity of those we serve, walking alongside them through healing, recovery, and renewal. Each service equips families with the skills and support to remain whole and face future challenges with confidence. In short, prevention turns struggles into stories with hopeful,





In-Home Prevention Models

Integral to our In-Home Prevention services are Family Centered Treatment® and Family Check Up®, evidence-based models of intensive in-home treatment that focus on working with the family to build a stable, healthy future.

Both models enable clinicians to directly observe families in their most comfortable setting – at home. Interacting with families at home makes it possible to directly intervene in unhealthy behaviors and to immediately reinforce positive, healthy choices. Saint Francis provides Family Centered Treatment® in Arkansas, Kansas, Nebraska, and the Texas Panhandle. Our Central Texas program utilizes Family Check Up®.

Texas Home Visiting is another in-home prevention program that serves families with children aged 5 years or younger and residing in McLennan and Bell Counties.

Foster Care Case Management

Foster care case management involves coordinating and overseeing the care and well-being of children and their families involved in the foster care system, and includes assessment, placement, case planning, monitoring, support, advocacy, and planning for permanency.

In Kansas, Saint Francis Ministries provides comprehensive case management and permanency services to children and families through our Reintegration/Foster Care/Adoption (RFCA) programs. Local Department for Children and Families offices refer children in need of out-of-home placement. Each child and family's situation and needs are immediately assessed, and children are placed in the least restrictive environment possible while maintaining connections with family, kin, school, and home community.

In Texas, we provide stability, permanency, and safety to children and families as a Single-Source Continuum Contractor. We work with more than 130 agencies across Texas to ensure children are placed in safe and caring placements and families are able to receive services to address the concerns which led to their children being removed from the home.

Fatherhood FIRE

A federally funded grant program, Fatherhood FIRE focuses on teaching men and women the skills they need to be better parents. Comprised of five distinct courses, Saint Francis Ministries provides the program free of charge in Kansas, Nebraska, Oklahoma, and Texas. Fatherhood FIRE supports stronger families by helping parents build relationships with their children, educating parents involved in domestic violence, and assisting families in achieving economic stability.





Seeking Safety®

Seeking Safety is another cornerstone of Saint Francis' In-Home Prevention Services toolbox. An extremely flexible, evidence-based model designed to help individuals with a history of trauma and substance misuse, Seeking Safety is available in Kansas, and offers 25 treatment topics focusing on cognitive, behavioral, and interpersonal issues. Since implementation, Seeking Safety has resulted in a 99% success rate in maintaining children at home during service delivery. During the year following referral, children remained in the home more than 91.8% of the time.





Behavioral Health

Accessible both remotely and in-person, Saint Francis Ministries Outpatient Behavioral Health department has offered healing and hope to individuals and families for more than two decades. Behavioral Health provides treatment and support for a wide variety of issues, including alcohol and drug counseling and outpatient services. All of our behavioral health programs are designed to meet the unique needs of both adults and adolescents.

Anchored by our Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facility (PRTF), Saint Francis provides compassionate, clinical care for children with both short-and long-term needs. Our residential services feature a range of treatment tools that include art therapy, equine therapy, and modalities. Each is designed to help youth overcome mental health and behavioral health struggles, so they can return to their families and communities to lead healthier lives.
