## Substance Use Assessment, Outpatient Treatment, and Intensive Treatment

The Saint Francis outpatient program is designed for adolescents and adults who are identified as having or possibly having a substance use history. We offer outpatient treatment services in Salina and can provide virtual services across Kansas.

- Support for adolescents in developing lifestyle habits to promote abstinence and recovery

- Collaboration with local district courts to provide services for families with truant children
- Peer Mentor Services

## Psychiatric and Medication Management Services

Services: Initial psychiatric evaluation, medication management, GeneSight® Psychotropic Testing, and medication assisted treatment.

GeneSight Psychotropic is a pharmacogenomic test that analyzes clinically important genetic variations in your DNA. The results of the test provide information to doctors about genes that may impact how patients metabolize or respond to certain medications.
